Georgia 4-H Winter/Spring 2021 Newsletter

After a year of challenges due to the Covid 19 pandemic, Georgia 4-H is excited to begin the process of 'getting back to normal,' and begin many in-person programs and activities including camp! Over the past year, our Centers came to a standstill as Georgia 4-H worked to curb the potential for health risks, but groups have again started booking and meeting in our Centers with safety measures in place.

Throughout the pandemic, our state and county faculty and staff created innovative programs to ensure 4-H'ers still have opportunities to participate through virtual formats, and many of those virtual programs are ongoing.

Included in this newsletter are several examples of those newly created and implemented virtual programs. We are also excited to share news about many exciting in-person events being held in the coming months.

PROJECT SAFE



Georgia 4-H's State BB Match was the biggest in-person event in more than a year. More than 500 youth, grades 4-9, participated in the contest on April 25, and almost 300 adult volunteers helped make it happen.

As part of Georgia 4-H Project SAFE, the State BB Match uses shooting sports to teach valuable life skills while providing youth a place to develop a sense of belonging, learn teamwork in a safe environment, and increase concentration skills.

CHAPEL REDEDICATION

The Rock Eagle Chapel stands in prominence once again as the heart of Rock Eagle. More than 200 donors and supporters attended the rededication of the chapel on June 6. Emeritus Foundation Board Member Jerry Griffin was a featured speaker.

Mr. Griffin met his wife in 4-H and they were married at the chapel.

Tours of the chapel were guided by members of the State Board of Directors and there was a special lunch program in the Dining Hall. Attendees enjoyed a performance by Clovers & Co. and the event turned into a wonderful reunion for generations of 4-Hers.






ZOOM INTO SCIENCE

Throughout the past year, Georgia 4-H has offered the "Zoom into Science" series for the state's youth. This STEM webinar series allowed Georgia 4-H'ers to directly engage with natural science experts in their respective fields. Not only do participants learn science content, but they are exposed to a variety of STEM-related careers during the onehour sessions.



This year's \$4 for 4-H event was held on social media on April 4th. Supporters from all 159 counties contributed to the Georgia 4-H Foundation during the online fundraiser. Nearly 500 donors contributed a total of \$31,061 to support Georgia 4-H's programs. Half of the money raised within each county was returned to them for their county activities. After much planning and anticipation, Georgia 4-H Summer Camp is BACK! More than 2,800 participants (youth and adult) will experience the magic of 4-H camp during eight sessions. This summer, a traditional residential 4-H Camp is being held exclusively at Rock Eagle. The capacity for each week is reduced to about half of our usual population for social distancing purposes, and the week has been shortened to a four-day/three-night adventure to allow for enhanced cleaning. Though there are a few differences this summer. 4-H'ers still have the opportunity to try new things, build relationships with their peers and leaders, experience independence as they spend time away from home and meet new people, and create memories to last a lifetime.







STATE CONGRESS 2021



Although State Congress was not held in person last year due to COVID-19, Georgia 4-H is thrilled to have over 300 young people participating at the event in Atlanta. The four days will include competition, recognition, and comradery. Also during the time at Congress, the group will travel to classic Atlanta attractions like the Georgia Aquarium, the High Museum of Art, Zoo Atlanta, the World of Coke, and the College Football Hall of Fame. A silent disco will also be held before the announcement of the newest Master 4-H'ers! Congress will conclude as participants are recognized at the traditional annual banquet.
